THE COMMUNITY OF WERRIBEE



Associate Professor Andrew MacIsaac, like many staff members has a long association with St Vincent's. In Andrew's case his connection started in the 1950s when his mother joined the nursing school and his father became a young resident doctor. "My father asked my mother out to a ball. A romance blossomed and they eventually married. Half the hospital was invited to the wedding!"

Growing up, Andrew often accompanied his father on ward rounds and so when he graduated from medicine it seemed natural to do his training at St Vincent's. Two of Andrew's brothers did the same. He adds, "I lived on campus and met my wife, a fellow resident. I now have a son who is a doctor and it's needless to say where his fiancé works!"

"It's wonderful to have that family connection. I still see interns arrive because their mother and or father have worked here and they are inspired by the same stories as I was."



THE GOOD SAMARITAN

We love this iconic photo from the St Vincent's archive, of the Sisters of Charity serving tea to unemployed men during the depression. "In this image the tea is being served in fine crockery with a pressed white tablecloth and beautifully prepared food", Margaret Stewart, Head of Mission says. "It perfectly encapsulates the Mission of the Sisters and their appreciation of the dignity of every person".

Inspired by the photo, generous and crafty supporters from around Australia, created over 200 beautifully made tea cosies for the St Vincent's Cosiest Morning Tea. The event raised funds for The Good Samaritan Fund a staff giving initiative which provides emergency relief to patients who are dealing with hardship and which has distributed over \$250,000 in much needed assistance.



THE POWER OF HOPE

Occupational Therapist Emma Parfitt has treated many patients in her career but there is one patient who stands out.

In 2014, Emma met Ray, who was admitted to the Rehab Ward following a car accident which left him with life threatening injuries. Emma and her colleagues worked tirelessly with Ray over the next ten months. Each day Ray faced major challenges and obstacles but one thing gave him a sense of autonomy and hope – his power wheelchair. It sped up his recovery.

Inspired, Emma set herself a challenge to raise enough money to purchase a new power wheelchair for the Rehab Ward, so others could also benefit from the latest wheelchair technology.

Emma ran a 42km trail marathon through bushland around Marysville and with support from family and friends, she successfully reached her fundraising goal.

As many of you will have read in our recent Christmas Appeal, our collective heart went out to the Forrester family of Shepparton, when in December last year, mum Una was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's t-cell lymphoma and began her long journey to fight this disease.

Una's devoted husband Steven and family spent last Christmas by Una's bedside. Steven remembers the difficult period they experienced and the importance of the kindness and understanding of those around them.

"If it wasn't for having a flexible employer, who allowed for

the 2.5 hour travel time to Melbourne, Una's treatment could have posed significant issues. The understanding and generosity from my workplace had a really positive effect on the wellbeing of my family.

I will never forget the day when the doctors, nurses and support staff arranged a birthday cake for Una. It was baked by the St Vincent's kitchen and everyone sang happy birthday to her and gave her warm hugs and best wishes.

Another time that stands out for me was when Una was very ill one night during her chemotherapy treatment and in a state of distress and despair. The nurse on duty held her hand, comforted and reassured her that the suffering would not last forever and that it would pass. Una held onto the nurse's words of compassion that night and during many other dark times in treatment".

As Una's daughter so eloquently said. "You have given us more time together, the biggest blessing of all! Thank you"
