Just-in-Time Project - The Aikenhead Centre for Medical Discovery (ACMD)

A major new ACMD research project is set to transform the way physicians surgically treat tumours and bone cancer. Using 3D printing, robotic surgery and improved process flows, the aim is to create tailored implants for patients with bone cancer in a shorter amount of time, which would dramatically improve healthcare outcomes.

The five-year research project is a collaboration between the Australian Government, RMIT University, the University of Technology Sydney, St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne, University of Melbourne and global medical technology firm, Stryker.

As well as cutting down the current time of four to six weeks to produce a solid implant, the custom-made, latticestructured implant is intended to improve long-term integration with the bone. The robotic removal of the tumour will allow for more exact margins to be achieved, thus reducing the re-occurrence rate of the tumour.

The lead researchers, St Vincent's Professor Peter Choong, RMIT's Professor Milan Brandt and the project team will use the remaining 2.5 years of the project to generate the evidence that these tailored implants will improve outcomes.

Professor Peter Choong explains that Just-In-Time 3D implants will transform the delivery of care for people with bone cancer.

"This process will expand the surgical options available to patients and surgeons and increase the potential for limb-saving surgery."

Ken Watts initially came to St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne from his home in Maffra for a routine heart stress test. Almost immediately he was told by his Cardiologist, A/Professor Andrew MacIsaac, to stop the test and was admitted straight into hospital for stent surgery.

Ken is proud of his family and his thriving supermarket business. Since selling the supermarket he has also been a successful share trader. This flair for buying and selling shares certainly runs in the family. Ken's great-grandfather, William Clarke, actually started the first stockbroking firm in Australia.

As well as enjoying many accomplishments and much happiness, Ken and his wife Gladys have also experienced tragedy. Suffering the loss of their much-loved son Malcolm, in his thirties, to Duchene muscular dystrophy. Through this experience and Ken's own health issues, they both understand and appreciate the importance of medical research to improve people's lives.

Ken and Gladys visited the Foundation office recently to present a cheque for \$50,000 to support the Hospital's efforts to go towards upgrading one of the emergency heart wards, known as the 'Cath Lab', which will save thousands of lives in the future.

"All of the staff at St Vincent's are wonderful and I owe my life to A/Prof Andrew MacIsaac. I think it is really important to give back. I hope this will inspire other dads or grandads to want to help St Vincent's as well."

Improving patient's experience with The HeART Walk

St Vincent's Hospital is proud to host one of the longest running Arts in Health programs in Australia. The Arts Program incorporates the St Vincent's Art Gallery, the Artist in Residence Program and the St Vincent's Public Art Collection. The art collection includes more than 1500 artworks, which are on display across hospital sites for patients, staff and visitors to enjoy.

The Arts Program Manager, Monique Silk says, "Displaying art throughout the hospital creates a calm, non-clinical and welcoming environment. It provides an opportunity for people to think about something else, even for a moment, during what is often a stressful time for our patients and their families."

The Arts Program in collaboration with the Aboriginal Health Unit and cardiac nurses would like to undertake the creation of The HeART Walk. Currently the Cardiac Unit has an extensive collection of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art and the team believe an art walk would inspire patients to get moving after their cardiac procedures. The HeART Walk would be a guided walking tour that they can do with staff, family or volunteers. While exercise is essential for recovery, The HeART Walk also encourages people to partake in a cultural and aesthetic experience.

Registered Nurse Karen Daws knows how much it would benefit the staff seeing everyone engaging with the art works and learning about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture.

Groundbreaking diabetes research

Director, Endocrinology and Diabetes, Professor Richard MacIsaac is a leader in the area of diabetes treatment and research. Diabetes affects a staggering 5.1% of Australia's population. His main research interest is diabetes and its complications, especially those related to cardiovascular and kidney disease.

Thanks to Prof MacIsaac and his team, St Vincent's is one of only two hospitals in Australia performing pancreas eyelet transplants. This is a cutting-edge procedure that aims to help people with type 1 diabetes avoid major hypoglycaemic (low blood sugar level) episodes and to potentially live without daily injections of insulin.

Prof MacIsaac has been a principal investigator for numerous diabetes-related clinical trials. Recruitment is currently open for the ORACL Study which is looking at the sleep benefits of the artificial pancreas. There is a wealth of information about treatment options, the medications used to treat mental illness, and management of general physical health including side effects and metabolic syndromes.
