

The St Vincent's Pacific Health Fund engages with health workers in the Pacific Region to provide essential equipment to hospitals, facilitate clinical exchange programs and to assist in capacity building through financial grants and scholarships.

Established in 2008, the Fund provides support to health workers in Pacific countries like Vanuatu, Papua New Guinea, Fiji, Kiribati, Cook Islands, Timor Leste and Solomon Islands.

The Fund is a rarity in today's society. 100% of all money donated has gone directly into funding either grants or scholarships. Administrative costs are zero. This has been achieved through the generous support of the St Vincent's Hospital which has waived any administrative fees, and the committee who donate their time to assess all applications.

Support continues at the Hospital through the Emergency Department, Mental Health, Mission and Foundation Directorates.

Over the past 11 years, more than \$200,000 has been awarded to 29 successful grant applications across nine of our Pacific neighbours. In 2018 alone, the committee provided just over \$32,000 for 13 projects that included training and support in six different countries.

The committee are extremely grateful for the assistance they receive from the community for this unique fund.

About the Fund

The St Vincent's Pacific Health Fund aims to:

- Promote and enable educational opportunities for medical and other health workers in the Pacific region
- Assist in capacity building of health services and personnel through the provision of directed grants to institutions and individuals for specific projects
- Create and promote links between St Vincent's, health workers and health institutions, particularly within the mission sector, in the Pacific region

These goals are achieved by providing financial support to selected grant applications and student scholarships.

The History

The St Vincent's Pacific Health Fund was established in 2008 by Associate Professor Andrew Dent, former Director of the St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne Emergency Department.

A/Prof Dent was an outstanding doctor with a lifelong passion for health in the developing world. He maintained ongoing contact with Papua New Guinea health care and medical education.

He was a visionary, a tireless advocate for the equitable 'whole-of-health' treatment of all patients, no matter what their station in life or their location on the planet.

A/Prof Dent was just 53 when he died in 2008 after a year-long battle with colon cancer. He donated his entire earnings from his many years of out-of-hours work to setup the St Vincent's Pacific Health Fund.

Since 2008, over **\$220,000** has been awarded to 34 successful grant applications in support of nine of our Pacific neighbours.



Stand-out Projects

The have been many exceptional and highly beneficial projects undertaken over the past 11 years. Here are some examples of a few key projects:

- The ongoing partnership with PNG Society of Rural and Remote Health which is a three year investment in professional development for rural doctors
- Working with the Yomunka Health Board for a year's worth of training health programs for volunteers in 2009
- Equipment and support for the children's high dependency unit on the Solomon Islands in 2010
- Mental health placement with St Vincent's mental health training program for the Nurse in Charge at Kiribati mental health services in 2016
