Thanks to your recent generosity, we raised over \$70,000 to purchase an additional ultrasound machine for the Emergency Department. The department sees on average 150 emergency cases each day, with many patients requiring the use of the ultrasound machine.

FAMILY VIOLENCE, STAFF FDUCATION

Women who suffer from a disability, such as severe mental health challenges, are twice as likely to suffer from family violence. It is important that our staff are trained to recognise and respond to family violence in public mental health services.

Social Work in Mental Health at St Vincent's have developed a staff training package and prompt cards for ready reference by clinicians. The team provided family violence education sessions in each area in Mental Health – including inpatient, community and residential – educating the service about evidence-based family violence knowledge and how to identify and respond.

"Asking appropriate questions, being a compassionate ally, and knowing what services are available and



how to access them, are really useful skills for mental health clinicians," says Senior Social Worker, Meg de Melo.

So far, more than 100 staff have undergone this very important training.

NAVY DOCTORS SAVE LIVES

Lieutenant Adam Scorer might be a Navy Doctor, but you'll find him providing care at St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne as the Australian Defence Force's capability to deploy medical specialists is enhanced through placements in civilian practices.

Lieutenant Scorer has spent the past 11 months working in anaesthesia here at St Vincent's, gaining valuable experience in the Intensive Care Unit and helping him secure a highly sought-after position in accredited anaesthetic training this year.

"Now that I have secured a position on an anaesthetic training program, I will spend the next five years completing my Fellowship in Anaesthesia in Melbourne, predominantly at St Vincent's Hospital in Melbourne and rotating through the Royal Women's and Children's Hospitals, Box Hill and Geelong," he said.

"Medical specialists can be deployed with short notice as part of humanitarian and disaster relief efforts in the Asia-Pacific region, including earthquakes and tsunamis, or in multinational health service roles on operations in the Middle East."

Medical Specialist Program Manager Commander Craig Spinks said: "Activating a specialist medical capability in 48 to 72 hours to respond to a disaster event becomes easier with fully qualified experts serving in the Navy full time."

ANNIVERSARY

St Vincent's Private Hospital celebrated its first year of operation on the 29th of January.

In just one year, more than 3,000 patients have been cared for and 100 newborns have been welcomed into the world.

In an exciting development in October 2018, Neurosurgeon and Spinal Surgeon Mr Girish Nair performed the first keyhole spinal surgery procedure at the hospital.

Mr Nair is the founder of statewide neurosurgical practice, Neuroaxis. The practice conducts many consultations in Werribee, however had never before performed keyhole spinal surgery in the area. That was until Tarneit resident Andrew came along.

Mr Nair successfully performed a two-hour microscopic keyhole laminectomy surgery, to help relieve pressure on the nerves in Andrew's back.

While the surgery itself was important for Andrew, it was also a first for the hospital and the surrounding area, with previous patients from Wyndham having to travel to a hospital in or around Melbourne for such surgery.

With this first now under our belt, the expectation is that St Vincent's Private Hospital Werribee will be able to perform more complex spinal surgeries, such as disc removals, within the next six to 12 months.

Dennis Pearson, from Casterton in the far south west of Victoria, was on the phone to his son when all of a sudden he began experiencing a severely painful headache.

Dennis was suffering a brain aneurism, a ballooning in a blood vessel of the brain that can potentially be fatal if it bursts, causing bleeding on the brain.

He was taken to the Hamilton Base Hospital and then airlifted to Melbourne for three urgent surgeries at St Vincent's.

"It was like somebody had drilled a hole in my head," Dennis says. "I had never experienced anything like that before."

After spending three weeks in ICU, Dennis was transferred to Rehab, where he stayed for another three weeks.

"By the time I got to Rehab, I could walk around, read and feed myself," Dennis says.

"I felt very glad that we were at St Vincent's," wife Christine says. "From the moment we arrived in the ambulance I trusted that everything that could be done would be done for Dennis. To watch the professionals work in harmony in critical situations was a sight to behold."

Dennis' daughter Fran says it is amazing to see him make such a miraculous recovery.

"Everyday he gets better," Fran says. "Some days we still see the effects of the brain injury but overall he is doing so well."

"People say it is a miracle that I'm here," Dennis says. "There's a way of going about things at St Vincent's that is very generous. To all the St Vincent's staff that looked after me, the doctors, nurses and support staff, I would like to express my very deep gratitude for what you have done."

BUILDING THE FUTURE OF PALLIATIVE CARE

Due to the increasing demand for palliative care services and the ageing infrastructure of the Caritas Christi palliative care service at Kew, there is now an urgent need to rebuild on the site.

The redevelopment will include a 120-bed aged care facility at the rear of the site, and a brand new 26-bed palliative care facility at the front of the block. The new Caritas Christi will have state-of-the-art facilities incorporating teaching spaces and improved staff and patient amenities. We anticipate the completion in early 2021.

There will be a range of events and campaigns to help us raise funds for the new building. We look forward to keeping you updated with progress.
