ABOUT ST VINCENT'S HOSPITAL, MELBOURNE

St Vincent's is one of Australia's pre-eminent hospitals, blessed with world-renowned clinicians and surgeons, equipped with cutting-edge technologies and staffed by committed, clever and caring people.

As an iconic non-profit Australian public hospital, St Vincent's receives limited government funding for capital development, equipment purchases and innovation.

In 1889, five Sisters of Charity arrived in Melbourne with a dream of establishing a hospital. Four years later, after working tirelessly to raise funds, the sisters opened a small cottage hospital with just 30 beds.

From its humble beginnings over 128 years ago, St Vincent's has grown from strength to strength, becoming a leading light in medical innovation, with an impressive range of medical firsts – Australia's first Intensive Care Unit, Australia's first hand transplant, and pioneering new approaches to cardiac surgery.

As the principal tertiary hospital in Victoria, St Vincent's performs a vital role in providing teaching and specialist training. The state-of-the-art teaching facilities offer the optimal learning experience for nurturing the future leaders of medicine. St Vincent's also attracts some of the most qualified and specialised health and health research professionals.
