Despite juggling work and a young family, Kirsten has remained dedicated to her studies, keeping up with the fast-paced learning to earn her postgraduate qualification.

Kirsten's commitment to her patients and her team and thirst for knowledge didn't go unnoticed. Last year, she was awarded a nursing scholarship and recognised as the 2023 Postgraduate Nurse of the Year. "It was such a surprise and honour to receive the scholarship."

After her father passed away, Kirsten was inspired to continue her studies. "Losing my father reinforced my passion for education. That's why I'm now doing my Masters. I want to learn to become a Nurse Practitioner because I love sharing the gift of knowledge with my peers and developing my skills further to benefit my patients." Thirteen years as a nurse at St Vincent's has taught Kirsten many things, but her enduring love of nursing comes down to the 'little things'. "It's always been the small wins that give me joy. Ensuring a male patient was clean-shaven after weeks of being unable to do it himself, advocating for a palliative patient to die at home, encouraging a patient to participate in physical rehabilitation after major heart surgery... the list goes on."

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Kirsten said she is very grateful to the generous people who give to the St Vincent's Hospital Nursing Excellence Scholarship Fund. "Thank you, your support has literally changed my career course. I can't wait to see what the future holds."

A tribute to a lifetime of **medical excellence**

World-renowned paediatric surgeon Justin Henry Kelly OAM's legacy and long connection to St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne will live on, with the establishment of the Justin Henry Kelly Prize for Excellence.

Justin Kelly dedicated his life to clinical excellence, medical education, and mentoring. His illustrious career spanned six decades, beginning with his training at the St Vincent's Clinical School.

His incredible contributions to medicine culminated in the development of a world-first surgical procedure for bladder exstrophy, a rare and complex condition. Justin Kelly's son Eamonn explained, "The 'Kelly procedure' corrects a rare birth defect in which the bladder develops outside the foetus. The exposed bladder can't store urine or function normally, resulting in incontinence. The procedure is now performed worldwide and impacts approximately 1 in 1,000,000 live births every year."

Four generations of the Kelly family, dating back to the 1920s, did their training at St Vincent's. Justin Kelly's daughter Emma said, "When dad developed Parkinson's Disease, St Vincent's was his hospital of choice. He always felt valued as a patient and as a person."

The Justin Henry Kelly Prize for Excellence will be awarded annually to a final-year student demonstrating outstanding clinical skills, academic distinction, and embodying qualities of humility, compassion, integrity, and service.

Now, nearly 30 years later, Steve reflects on the exceptional care and support that has continued through regular check-ups and follow-ups.

Steve's life-changing experience with St Vincent's led him and his wife, Jacqui to make a deeply personal choice: to leave a gift in his will to support the hospital. His decision is a testament to his gratitude.

Steve said that deciding to leave a gift in his Will was a tremendous comfort to both him and Jacqui. Harnessing the **power** of virtual reality to save lives

An international training program led by St Vincent's Hospital Melbourne is taking the next step in supporting doctors from rural Kenya by using a device similar to **Google Glasses to supervise complicated** cardiac surgeries remotely.

Established in 2022, the initial program saw Dr Keith Dindi, a cardiac and general surgeon at Tenwek-a 400-bed hospital in Kenya-spend 18 months training at St Vincent's. Dr Dindi's training focused on minimally invasive thoracic and vascular surgical techniques and the management of ischaemic heart disease. Since completing the program, Dr Dindi has performed more lifesaving surgeries in six months than in the previous ten years!

Oesophageal cancer and heart failure brought on by rheumatic heart disease affect thousands of people across the African continent.

"While we might see 50 cases of oesophageal cancer a year, they see close to 700 and even in children as young as 11," explained Dr Matthew Read, an Upper Gastrointestinal surgeon at St Vincent's who has played a key role in establishing this unique training program.





Tenwek Hospital previously had no surgeons trained to perform these surgeries, which meant the operations could only be conducted every few months when a skilled surgeon visited Kenya.

Using technology to bridge the gap.

The program is set to expand with the introduction of technology to provide real-time guidance to surgeons during complex operations.

Dr Read said, "The first step was to create a secure internet connection at Tenwek Hospital. This has been achieved thanks to Australian company Netlinkz, who generously donated two satellite dishes. From there, we need to source the best 'smart glass' technology."

"By bringing this technology to one of the most under-resourced countries in the world, we can have the biggest impact. I'm proud that St Vincent's is one of the pioneers of this program which will be relatively low-risk and high-reward. The main risk is making it sustainable to ensure it can continue."

How generosity is **changing cancer treatment**

At St Vincent's Private Hospital Werribee, we believe in providing our patients with the best possible care, not only for their medical needs but also for their emotional well-being.

Thanks to the love and support from guests who attended events held to raise funds for St Vincent's Werribee, we are thrilled to announce the purchase of a state-of-the-art scalp cooling system that will significantly enhance the treatment experience for our cancer patients.

What is scalp cooling?

Scalp cooling is designed to minimise hair loss during chemotherapy (chemo). The system works by cooling the hair follicles to decrease the flow of chemo to the scalp. Patients have said keeping their hair has helped them feel more like themselves during such a challenging time.

Emma Saliba, General Manager and Director of Clinical Services at St Vincent's Private Hospital Werribee said, "Contributions from the Werribee community have made a profound impact. The scalp cooling program empowers patients to face treatment with confidence and dignity.
